- 1. As a small group, choose a project or activity to map (in this case, the project will be your community garden project).
- 2. List the assets (skills, resources) that each member of the group can bring to the community garden project. In other words, what assets do members *of this group possess?* Below are some questions you could ask as you work to discover these assets.

People (interview or informal conversation setting):

- What are your talents? What are your interests or hobbies? What do you enjoy doing? What can you teach others?
- How would you like to be involved in the community garden?
- What skills, talents, resources, materials, or supplies could you share to support the community garden effort?
- What groups or networks are you a part of?
- What are the positive things you see in the community? What changes would you like to see take place in the community?


Organizations (based your own research):

- What local organizations and businesses exist within the community?
- What are the various missions or purposes of these organizations/businesses?
- Who do they work with or partner with?

• How can these organizations serve as potential partners for the community garden?

Community:

- What community traditions can be preserved through the community garden?
- How can community members be connected to their culture through the use of the community garden?
- What arts or crafts can be created or supported in the garden effort?
